



RE: No Surprises Act Notice Requirements

Dear Producer:

As you may know, the recently enacted No Surprises Act mandates that each health insurance broker disclose, to potential and existing customers, the direct compensation that the health insurance broker receives from a health insurance company. The disclosure is required before an individual customer finalizes their plan selection.

Section 12 (F) of the Producer Agreement between Mountain Health Coop (MHC) and Producers provides as follows:

Producer agrees to comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations and with any policies and procedures, whenever adopted, established by MHC related to Producers.

MHC is committed to following the requirements of the No Surprises Act. Therefore, MHC is providing this letter to give Producers notice that MHC expects Producers to comply with the disclosure requirements of the No Surprises Act. A Producer's failure to comply will be considered a material breach of the Producer Agreement.

Attached you will find an Agent/Broker Compensation Disclosure form that Producers may use to comply with the disclosure requirement of the No Surprise Act. The Agent/Broker Compensation Disclosure form can also be found on MHC's website.
